We invite you to attend our 56th Annual Meeting, to be held on **Wednesday, January 24th, 2018**, for a wonderful evening at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. Originally opened in 1876 and located in the Fenway since 1909, the Museum has since grown to encompass nearly 450,000 works of art, welcoming more than one million visitors each year. We are excited to offer this inspiring cultural resource as a venue for our meeting, and invite you to come to view artwork and stay for our reception and presentation by Christine Poff, Community Preservation Director for the City of Boston.

The meeting will begin at 6:00 PM in the Riley Seminar Room at the Museum of Fine Arts – we request that **all entries** take place through The Fenway entrance (North Side of Building). *We will have tickets available from 5:00 p.m. so that you may stop to enjoy art before the event* – look for a Fenway Civic Association sign and volunteer in the lobby to pick up your admission ticket. MFA Members can use their membership cards for entry.

**Riley Seminar Room** is on the first floor of the Linde Family Wing, near the main Bookstore & Shop and Taste Café. From the Fenway entrance, take an immediate right and walk down to the Foster Gallery for special exhibitions. From Foster, turn left through the double glass doors into the open Linde Family Wing galleria. Just before the café, turn left into Riley (Room 156). Should you need help finding the room, a museum guard can always direct you.

A reception and social time will be followed by a short program and our featured speaker, Community Preservation Director Christine Poff, who will present “*The Community Preservation Act: A New Day for Boston's Neighborhoods*”. Come learn about this important new resource and what it offers for open space, housing, and historic preservation in the Fenway.
